Our Vision

Expanded Emergency Department redesigned for maximum efficiency

The CVHS Emergency Department averaged 168 patient visits per day in 2019 in spaces designed for 140 visits. The new design creates more treatment areas that are outfitted for more care options, including those for bariatric and behavioral health patients. Providers will be more efficient, and patients will have quicker access to needed care.

Following a new model for emergency treatment, we will create areas for “Vertical Care,” a concept that allows ambulatory patients to be treated without taking a bed from an emergent patient. These rooms require less space than traditional rooms so more patients can be treated in the same space, making wait times much shorter.

Patients in psychiatric crisis, especially children and adolescents, often spend hours or even days waiting for placement elsewhere in rooms that have few comforts for the patient or their family. A new challenge for our Emergency Department providers is the length of stay for social holds – patients with nowhere to go who cannot go home alone. An updated behavioral health area will provide safe, private, and secure common spaces with dedicated bathrooms and calming interiors. Central monitoring stations will ensure the safety of both patients and staff.

Additionally, the new design allows for three medication rooms, centrally located to patient care areas but secured and monitored for safety. These medication rooms will be specifically upfitted to get patients needed medications immediately so the healing process can begin.

A Heart and Vascular Center with all services in one area

Modern advances in technologies to treat heart and vascular disease focus on prevention more than invasive surgical treatments. Therefore, when a repair is needed, we must be prepared and ready for heart catheterizations, interventional radiologic and vascular procedures, and other cutting-edge techniques. Yet, the Cardiac Catheterization Lab at our medical center is currently at capacity and undersized for the volume handled. In addition, interventional procedures by vascular surgeons are competing for space in this area. We need larger and better-equipped rooms to allow our physicians to perform more efficiently.

With the new design, all heart and vascular services will be in one area of the hospital with a short transport route from the Emergency Department. The current undersized Cath Lab will be replaced with a right-sized, technologically sound space, and another lab will be built to accommodate electrophysiology, invasive radiology and vascular procedures. A third lab shell will be built for future expansion of heart services because we will never stop adding innovative procedures.

Along with increasing capacity, more areas for pre- and post-procedure treatments will be added and placed closer to procedure areas. Treatment for a heart or vascular procedure – planned or emergent – will be in one location, which is better for the patient, the family and the staff.
