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# RISE (Robust Internship Student Experiences) Program

The RISE Program allows interns from all Catawba County high schools to complete observation experiences in a multitude of different healthcare professions, to include both clinical and non-



clinical areas. Interns participate in team building activities and hospital tours to allow the opportunity to see state-of-the-art technologies utilized by CVMC. A banquet is held at the completion of each cohort (fall & spring semesters) to celebrate intern accomplishments.

- Complete application process with school representative
- Must be able to participate in all activities (internship, mid-semester meeting, banquet)
